#### Dear Class of 2024 and Parents.

We know this is an exciting time of year as you make your post-graduation plans. We hope the enclosed information will be beneficial in supporting you in this process. This packet includes a comprehensive list of available local scholarships, as well as detailed instructions for completing the application for the local scholarships.

The local scholarships included in this booklet are made possible by the generous donations and fundraising efforts of our philanthropic citizens and community. Each year thousands of dollars are awarded to support our graduates in their pursuit of higher education.

Students are encouraged to apply for any and all scholarships for which they are eligible. Please read and follow the application instructions carefully. These scholarships are competitive, providing the best representation of yourself in your application is critical.

## FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION - Helpful Information Sheet

Financial Aid is funding awarded to individual students to help pay for education related expenses such as tuition, housing, books, and miscellaneous fees. Financial aid can come from individual colleges/universities; local, state, and federal governments; individuals; and private or public businesses and organizations. Financial aid can include need or merit-based scholarships, grants, loans, tuition waivers, and work-study programs.

Most need-based financial aid is determined through the completion of the federal **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. Some colleges/universities may require additional financial aid forms. In addition, most need-based financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis; therefore, students should complete the **FAFSA** or other required forms as soon as possible. The **FAFSA** must be completed annually. Students should contact the financial aid office of the college/university in which they will attend for specific information or questions about their **FAFSA** or about their financial aid award/package.

Scholarships can be awarded based on merit, need, or a combination. Merit based scholarships are awarded based on a student's academic or other accomplishments such as athletics, leadership, talents, or etc. Need based scholarships are awarded based on a financial need. Grants are monies that usually do not need to be repaid. Loans can be government or privately sponsored. Tuition waivers would be awarded from the college/university. Work-study programs allow a student to earn money toward their educational expenses by working.

#### **Additional Reminders:**

- Seniors who have not ordered their cap and gown or announcements should contact the main office *immediately.*
- IMPORTANT: Make sure you put time and effort into the scholarship applications. This includes taking your time to answer essay questions, along with editing and revising before submitting. Scholarships are competitive, your submitted materials will be all that is considered for the donors. Represent yourself well!

#### SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

- **1.** Look through this packet carefully and determine which scholarships you meet the requirements for.
- 2. Complete the <u>Student Information Sheet</u> (Common Application)
  - Click the link above and fill out the information sheet fully!
  - Once complete, "share" with your counselor. We will print it for you, and leave it with our secretary, Mrs. Jennings, for you to pick up and sign.
  - After you & your parent/guardian(s) sign, please return back to the Counseling Office.
- **3.** Reach out to at least 3 adults (non-family members) and ask if they can write you a Letter of Recommendation for the local scholarships you are applying for.
  - Some committees request letters from school personnel while others require letters from
    people outside the school. To help those people you are asking to write letters, we have
    "Letter of Recommendation Request" sheets for you to provide them with (via in person or
    email). This is optional, but helpful for those who are writing a letter for you.
  - When asking an adult for a Letter of Recommendation:
    - Provide at least two weeks notice
    - Pass along your Letter of Recommendation Information sheet (via email or in person)
    - Notify them that they can send their L.O.R. to your counselor (via email) and include your counselor's email for them.
  - NOTE: We can use the same Letter of Recommendation for multiple scholarships, you do
    not need different letters of recommendation for *every* scholarship, unless noted on the
    criteria.
- **4.** Complete the **Requirement Sheets** for each Scholarship you want to apply for. These are the links provided next to each scholarship title.
  - These provide insight on what else needs to be included when applying.
  - Upon making a copy, name the document with the scholarship title your name (example: Grandview Education Foundation Scholarship Your First & Last Name)
  - Once FULLY completed, submit to your counselor by clicking "share."
- 5. Done!
  - Your counselor will print off the "shared" application you send via email.
  - Remember: You can apply for as many scholarships as you'd like!

#### Keep In Mind:

- Some committees may choose to interview students. You will be notified if you are to be interviewed, so stay up to date on your email.

## Aspiring Educator Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who plan to pursue a future in Education)

- Amount: 2 @ \$500
- Requirements: Essay explaining why you want to be a teacher.
- **Details**: This scholarship was established by Dr. Stephanie Amaya, Grandview C-4 Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources, in 2024 to encourage students to enter the field of education. Applicants must be majoring in education and have financial need.

## **Belton Regional Medical Center Staff Scholarship** - Click Here

(Specifically students interested in the Medical Field)

- Amount: \$1000
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** The Medical Staff of Belton Regional Medical Center is offering a scholarship to a GHS senior who will attend a college or vocational school majoring in the medical career field.

## Cass Community Health Foundation Scholarship - Deadline March 15, 2024

(Specifically students interested in Nursing or Health Related Careers)

- Amount: TBD
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay
- **Details:** Scholarships range from \$750 to \$2,500 each. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and an ACT score of 20. These scholarships are available for high school seniors pursuing a nursing or other health related career. *Applicants must have a GPA of a 3.0 or higher, along with an ACT of 20 or higher, to be considered. ## **Charles Criniere Memorial Scholarship** - Click Here

- Amount: \$1000
- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation & Two-Page Essay
- **Details:** To honor the memory and work of Charles Criniere, his colleagues established this scholarship in 2023. Mr. Criniere served as a dedicated math teacher at GHS for 9 years and Martin City K-8 for 1 year before his unexpected passing. Charles created a WELCOMING environment and was passionate about inspiring today's youth to BELIEVE in themselves and AIM HIGH towards accomplishing their dreams, or personal goals. Charles dedicated his life to service for others. Applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA, plan on attending a post-secondary institution in the Fall, participate in one or more sports/activities, must have verifiable volunteer experience, and lastly display a positive attitude, have integrity, and commitment to the success of all around them.

# Diana Bundy Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who plan to pursue a future in English, Creative Writing, or Journalism)

- Amount: \$500
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & 3 Writing Samples
- **Details**: In memory of Diana Bundy, family and friends established this scholarship when she passed away in 2021. Diana taught English and Creative Writing in Grandview for 32 years, was the sponsor of Literary Magazine and National Honor Society. Students who remember Diana from her classes share that she helped them to find their authentic voices and encouraged them to express themselves through the written word. She wrote poetry weekly, was an avid reader, and encouraged everyone to write...in a journal, write a poem, or essay, or just jot thoughts on the back of an envelope. *Applicants must have strong language arts skills, at least a 3.0 GPA, and demonstrate financial need. Any student may apply but preference will be given to students who are pursuing a degree in English, Creative Writing, or Journalism.*

# ESP Bonus - Click Here

• Amount: \$500 - \$2000

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (at least 1 from current employer), Work History, Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** ESP Bonus is a fund designated for currently employed GHS students who have worked during their high school years to save money for college. It is administered through the Grandview Education Foundation. Number and specific scholarship amounts will be determined after evaluation of applications.

# Floyd Newman Foundation Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who plan to study Art, Fashion, Theatre, Journalism, Creative or Digital Arts)

• Amount: \$500

- Requirements: Supplemental Information Sheet & Essay
- **Details:** This scholarship is for seniors who are interested in pursuing a career in Music, Fashion, Art, Photography, Theatre, Writing, Journalism, Film, Dance, Graphic Design, UX/UI, Gaming, Marketing, or Technology/IT. Alexis McDowell graduated from Grandview High in 2013 and also attended the University of Missouri. She founded The Monarch Higher Education Scholar Program through the Floyd Newman Foundation in 2019. The Monarch Higher Education Scholar Program is designed to support high school students interested in pursuing education and/or certification after high school graduation. We strive to give our awardees academic support, mental preparation, and financial awareness. Awarding this scholarship is just a small token of our contribution to give to outstanding graduating seniors.

## **Grandview Education Foundation Scholarship** - Click Here

• Amount: 5 @ \$1000

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation, Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: In 1997 the Grandview Education Foundation was established to accept charitable contributions from private individuals, businesses, and other organizations who seek to provide resources to the district beyond tax funding. *Applicants must have a GPA of a 3.0 or higher, involved with the school/community activities, & display financial need.*

## GHS Athletic Bulldog Booster Club Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically for GHS Athletes)

• Amount: 2 @ \$500

- Requirements: Booster Club Scholarship Application Pick this up in the Counseling Office, Letter of Recommendation from Coach, List of Student Volunteer Work, & Essay
- **Details**: The Grandview Bulldog Booster Club is offering one or more scholarships to GHS students who meet the following criteria: Athlete must have participated in at least one sport during their junior/senior year, must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher, parent/guardian must be a **current paid member** (it's not too late to join) of the Grandview Athletic Booster Club during the athlete's senior year <u>and</u> have met at least **one** of the following criteria: worked at least twice in the concession stand (not too late to help) or held a position on the booster club executive board or was a team representative (within the booster club) for at least two years or student must have volunteered **5** hours of time helping the booster club.

## GHS Diamond Club Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically for GHS Softball/Baseball Players)

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation
- **Details:** Grandview High School Diamond Club is pleased to offer a scholarship to an eligible graduating senior of GHS who has a minimum GPA of a 3.0 and has lettered at least 2 years in softball or baseball.

# GHS Touchdown Club Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically for GHS Football Players)

• Amount: \$250

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation
- **Details:** Grandview High School Touchdown Club is pleased to offer a scholarship to an eligible graduating senior of GHS who has a minimum GPA of a 3.0 and has lettered at least 2 years in football.

## Grandview Lions Club Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

Amount: TBD

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation + Swan C. Norby Trust Scholarship (Below)
- **Details**: The Grandview Lions Club Scholarship Committee awards scholarships through the club's scholarship fund. In addition, it oversees and administers scholarships for the Swan C. Norby Trust, a trust left by Mr. Norby to provide scholarships for Grandview High School students. Students are eligible to receive one, not both, scholarships. Recipients of the award may reapply if they do satisfactory college work, remain in school and have need. The recipient of the Norby must agree to a substance free contract. *For the Grandview Lions Scholarship Applicants: Only the Grandview Scholarship Application is needed*

#### **NEW - Grandview Martin City PTA Scholarship – Click Here**

• Amount: \$500

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic/question included on application), Must have attended Martin City K-8.
- **Details**: Martin City's PTA sponsors a \$500 scholarship to a graduate who attended Martin City Elementary/Middle School. The award will be Three letters of recommendation and a short essay is required.

#### NEW - Grandview National Education Association (NEA) Scholarship - Click Here

• Amount: 2 @ \$500

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay
- **Details:** This scholarship may be used at any college, vocational or trade school. The award will be based on scholastic achievement, character, and need.

#### **Grown in Grandview - Class of 1974 - Click Here**

(Specifically students who grew up in Grandview)

• Amount: 2 @ \$500

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** The GHS class of 1974 established this scholarship during their 45<sup>th</sup> high school class reunion as a way of giving back to the Grandview School District. *Applicants with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, demonstrate financial need, and are involved in school activities may apply.*

# Jane Bryan Community Scholarship - Click Here

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (1 from School Personnel, 1 from Community Person, 1 other by choice), Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** This scholarship was established in 2014 to honor Jane Bryan and her 60+ years of service to the Grandview School District and community. Jane, a GHS alum, spent her entire 40-year teaching career in Grandview, as an English & Social Studies teacher, and then a librarian. She served two terms on the Grandview Board of Education and serves on the Board of the Grandview Education Foundation. *Applicants will be considered based on academic achievement (top 10% of the class), and involvement in both school and community activities.*

#### Jason Paul Noonan-Kurtz Memorial Scholarship

(Specifically for a student who attends CAIR)

Amount: \$1000 (Renewable!)

• Details: The Jason Noonan-Kurtz Memorial Scholarship is a scholarship awarded annually to a graduate of the Center for Alternative Instructional Resources. Unlike many scholarships that are available only to students who have the greatest financial need or the highest-grade point averages, every student who graduates from the Center for Alternative Instructional Resources and applies for the scholarship is eligible. The scholarship panel will select semi-finalists to interview from the pool of applicants. Essay Required: Essay Prompt: Why are you applying and how will this scholarship help you? – See CAIR Office.

## Jenna D. Rhodes Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

• Amount: \$1000

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (1 school personnel, 2 community) & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** Jenna Denise Rhodes attended Grandview schools starting with kindergarten at Meadowmere and she graduated from GHS in 1997. She then went to Northwest Missouri State to earn a bachelor's degree and returned to GHS where she taught science and coached tennis. After several years teaching at GHS and earning a Master's degree in Education at UMKC, Jenna followed her passion for building relationships within communities by moving to Arkansas to attend the Clinton School of Public Service. While there she earned a Master's degree in Public Service and a Master's Degree in Public Health. Jenna then used her knowledge and talents to bring people together for change to improve communities all across Arkansas. Jenna's family established this scholarship in her memory after she died unexpectedly in July of 2019. *Applicants must have at least a 2.5 GPA and will be considered based on school & community involvement, and demonstrate financial need.*

## Jess L. Taylor Community Scholarship - Click Here

• Amount: 2 @ \$750

- Requirements: Must have attended GHS for at least 3 years, 3 Letters of Recommendation, Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: This scholarship was created in acknowledgement and appreciation for Mr. Taylor's service to the district and community. He served as the Superintendent of Schools from 1948 until his death in 1960. Applicants will be considered on the basis of character, school/community service, scholarship, health, personality, and need.

#### Jimmy Foy Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

• Amount: 2 @ \$1000

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation (1 from non-teaching school district employee and 1 from a community member), Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: This scholarship was established in memory of Jimmy Foy, a 23-year veteran of the Grandview School District. At the time of his passing in 2018, Jimmy was the Director of Maintenance for the district, but had also worked as Head Custodian at both GHS and Meadowmere Elementary. Family and friends have contributed to this scholarship in his memory. Jimmy was dedicated to his career and conscientious in his work. He was a powerful, positive influence in the lives of all who knew him. This scholarship will be awarded based on character, personality, school/community involvement, and need. *Applicants must have a GPA of a 2.5 or higher and be involved with the school/community.*

## John J. & Ethel L. Strode Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who plan on attending MU or UMKC)

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- Details: Daughter Kay Strode Harbert, and her husband, Charles Harbert, established this scholarship to
  honor the contributions of her parents to education and community service in Grandview. John Strode served
  on the Grandview Board of Education for 15 years and both John and Ethel were active in community
  organizations. This scholarship is administered through the University of Missouri.

#### Kansas City South Rotary Scholarship - Click Here (& Pick Up Additional Application in Counseling Office)

- Amount: \$1000
- Requirements: Additional (Supplemental) Application & Essay (essay topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: The Kansas City South Rotary Club is committed to assisting high school graduates in the Grandview and South Kansas City area. Scholarships are available to students seeking higher education based on grades, demonstrate financial need, and devotion to service within their schools and communities.

## Kathy Meyers Founding Member Scholarship - Click Here

- Amount: \$1000
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (1 School Personnel & 1 Community Member), Essay: My Life's Purpose
- **Details**: In 2018, the Grandview Education Foundation established the Kathy Meyers Founding Member Scholarship. Kathy was a founding member of GEF in October of 1997 and continues to serve on the board. This scholarship was established to honor her dedication and hard work for GEF and the Grandview School District. Kathy is a GHS alum, served on the GC-4 Board of Education for many years, and works as the executive assistant to the superintendent. She's a true advocate for the students and staff of the district. The scholarship will be awarded based on character, above average grades, good citizenship, and demonstrate financial need. *Applicants may be emailed to be interviewed during the selection process*.

# Larry R. Downing Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

- Amount: \$500
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation, Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: This scholarship was established in 2006 by friends and family to honor Larry R. Downing, former English teacher and longtime assistant principal at Grandview High School. All of Mr. Downing's professional career as an educator was with the Grandview C-4 School District, where he spent over 37 years encouraging others. The scholarship criteria of good school citizenship, involvement in school/community activities, financial need, and above average grades are aspects that Mr. Downing believed to be important.

#### Lori DeAnda Latinx Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically for female students of Latinx heritage)

- Amount: \$500
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic included on application)
- Details: Upon her retirement in 2021, family and friends of Lori established this scholarship to honor her 31 years of service to the Grandview School District. Ms DeAnda served in many capacities during her years in Grandview. She was a middle school teacher, high school special education teacher, a counselor at Grandview Alternative School (GAS), District Coordinator for Alternative Services, Principal at the Center for Alternative Instructional Resources (CAIR) and served her last 7 years as Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources. Ms. DeAnda wanted all students and staff to have positive experiences in the GSD and she worked hard to see that happen. Her scholarship will be awarded to a female of Latinx heritage who will be attending a 2 or 4 year college, trade, or vocational school. Additionally, the applicant must excel in the classroom with a minimum 3.0 GPA, demonstrate ongoing leadership, service to the community, and financial need.

# Ray & Mary Klapmeyer/Grandview High School Scholarship - Click Here

- Amount: \$1000
- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (1 from staff, 2 from outside personnel)

• **Details:** This scholarship was established in the early 70's through an endowment provided by the Ray & Mary Klapmeyer estate to provide scholarships for Grandview High School seniors. The scholarship is awarded based on financial need, scholastic achievement and promise, service and activities in school and community, and character. Recipients of the scholarship are invited to interview with the committee during their freshman, sophomore and junior years in college for the purpose of renewal. Renewal is based upon the same criteria as the initial award. *Applicants must have attended Grandview High School for at least 3 years.* 

## Reginald M. Collier Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

• Amount: \$1000

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation & Short Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** The Reginald M. Collier Memorial Scholarship group will award a \$1,000 scholarship to one graduating Grandview High School senior that will be attending an accredited university, college, community college, trade, or technical school as a full-time student in the upcoming Fall.

## Ritchey Lowe Memorial Scholarship - Click Here

(For female students who plan to pursue a study of mathematics or science)

• Amount: \$500

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details:** This scholarship was established by family and friends when Ritchey passed away unexpectedly in September of 2021. Ms. Lowe taught math in Grandview for 30 years before her retirement in 2020. She began as a high school math teacher and then taught middle school math for 28 years. Ritchey had a quick wit, clever sense of humor, an infectious laugh and a warm smile. People who knew Ritchey may not remember what she taught them, or what she said but they will never forget how she made them feel. She made them feel important and valued. Her scholarship will be awarded to a female student who demonstrates outstanding mathematical ability. *Applicants must be female, have a minimum 3.0 GPA, demonstrate strong mathematical ability, and plan to pursue the study of mathematics or science in college.*

#### Sandra Howard Theatrical Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically for GHS Theater Students)

• Amount: \$250

- Requirements: Resume of Fine Arts Participation & Short Essay
- **Details:** This scholarship is established in honor of Sandra Howard, a former theatre teacher at GHS. Her commitment to excellence in theatre ensured the continuation and success of the Theatre Department. She continued to be a strong supporter of high school theatre throughout the KC area. This scholarship is awarded to a senior who enjoys supporting theatre productions, whether that is through active participation or as a passionate patron or audience member. The scholarship will be distributed to the selected nominee in the second semester of his/her freshman year with proof of passing grades (C or above). *Applicants will be considered based on their contribution to the GHS Theatre Department, GPA, and demonstrate financial need.*

#### Sodexo Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who completed ProStart)

- Requirements: 2 Letters of Recommendation (one school, one community) & Short Essay "What Good Service Looks Like"
- **Details:** Sodexo is awarding a scholarship to a senior who has successfully completed the 13-week Pro Start Class with at least a "B" and is entering a 2 or 4 year culinary, nutrition, or hospitality program. *Applicants will be considered based on financial need and Pro Start grade. Experience in the food service industry preferred, but not required.*

# Swan C. Norby Trust Scholarship - Click Here

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation, Grandview Lions Club Memorial Scholarship Application,
- Details: The Grandview Lions Club Scholarship Committee awards scholarships through the club's scholarship fund. In addition, it oversees and administers scholarships for the Swan C. Norby Trust, a trust left by Mr. Norby to provide scholarships for Grandview High School students. Students are eligible to receive one, not both, scholarships. Recipients of the award may reapply if they do satisfactory college work, remain in school and have need. The recipient of the Norby must agree to a substance free contract. For the Swan Norby Applicants: Grandview Scholarship Application (from above) Plus the Swan Norby documents.

#### The Taylor Scholar-Athlete Award Scholarship - Click Here

(Specifically students who have played a sport for at least 2 years)

• Amount: \$500

- Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation (teacher, coach, non-relative such as church, community, or employer) & Essay (topic/question included on application)
- **Details**: This scholarship was established by Tyrone and Melanie Taylor, who are residents of Grandview. For 16 years, they raised their four children in the Grandview school district with all of them graduating with honors from GHS. During those years, the Taylor children participated in various sports from middle school through high school while excelling academically. This scholarship will be awarded to a GHS graduating senior who has demonstrated academic success all four years of high school and has played a team sport for at least 2 years. *Criteria*: 3.25 or higher GPA; plans to attend an accredited college/university or community college; NO disciplinary record; has participated in a team sport for at least two years; community service is not required but considered.

## Belton-Grandview Masonic Lodge Scholarship - Not available

• Amount: \$500

• **Details:** The Masonic Lodge is offering a scholarship to a full-time student, have at least a 3.0 GPA and plan to attend a 4 year accredited college or university.

#### Grand Lodge of Missouri Masonic Scholarship - Not available

• Amount: \$500

• **Details:** The Grand Lodge of Missouri is offering a scholarship for a graduating senior that has a grade point average of at least a 3.0, is involved in extracurricular activities, and has an ACT score of 18 or higher.

#### <u>Grandview Community Teachers Association Scholarship</u> - Not available

• Amount: \$500

• Requirements: 3 Letters of Recommendation & Essay
